

Land Sale Update

- The closing on the undeveloped acreage to the west of Mission Field was 5-April-2023 to Pulte Homes
- Pulte is building single-family, single-story homes on the property
- The sales price was over \$6M and will be paid in three installments over 2 years
- A church body townhall meeting, Dare to Dream, was held on 25-Jun-23 to discuss the Lord's leading in using these funds
- Several projects are now completed and others underway from ideas suggested in that meeting

God is Good

- The financial state of the church is healthy
 - The church has no debt
 - Giving is good but below budget, ~8% (Economic challenges are real)
 - Our current budget is approximately \$3.2M
 - We have a healthy reserve fund and land sale income
- Balances as of July 31, 2023
 - Reserve Fund: \$ 750,000
 - Special Missions: \$ 147,439
 - Benevolence: \$ 110,483
 - Property Improvement:
 - Capital Improvement: \$ 1,800,000
 - Land sale promissory note \$ 4,000,000
- \$ 336,866 (Some funds allocated to projects)

Other Financial News

- The annual independent financial review was conducted by Carr, Riggs and Ingram CPAs, August 18, 2023
 - Based on their review, they concluded our financial statements are in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and they are not aware of any material modifications that should be made to our financial statements
- The FC has made good progress in resolving long-standing cell tower issues thanks to Dave Jarvis
- The budget for next year is being developed and a recommendation will be presented to the members in November
 - The vote on the budget will be in December
- The FC recommends that you consider Qualified Charitable Distributions from your IRA if you take a Required Minimum Distribution


Lead Pastor - Deacons
